In most major fields, students will be considered to have fulfilled the College Graduation requirement in the division of their major (Humanities, Social Sciences, or Natural Sciences and Mathematics). Chicana/o Studies and African and African American Studies majors fulfill the requirements of the division of their major concentration only. Women and Gender Studies majors may only fill the CLAS Social Sciences area with courses in their major.
